Market Insight _____

- Depakote ER is indicated
 - as monotherapy and adjunctive therapy in the treatment of adult patients and pediatric patients down to the age of 10 years with complex partial seizures that occur either in isolation or in association with other types of seizures;
 - as monotherapy and adjunctive therapy for simple and complex absence seizures in adults and children 10 years of age or older;
 - as adjunctive therapy in adults and children 10 years of age or older with multiple seizure types that include absence seizures;
 - for treatment of acute manic or mixed episodes associated with bipolar disorder, with or without psychotic features; and
 - for prophylaxis of migraine headaches.
- The tablet formulation is AB-rated and will be available as a single-source generic product.
- The generic formulation of Depakote delayed release was approved and launched on July 29, 2008.

- Brands: Topamax® (topiramate, Ortho-McNeil Pharmaceutical, Inc.), Keppra® (levetiracetam, UCB Inc.)
- Generics (various manufacturers): valproic acid, divalproex sodium, carbamazepine, oxcarbazepine, lamotrigine, ethosuximide

 - 250 mg: \$167.91 per package of 100 tablets
 - 500 mg: \$295.36 per package of 100 tablets
